If your scores qualify, you can earn course credit at many colleges. Send your scores to the college you will attend in the fall.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Compare aid information. Contact financial aid officers if you have questions. If you have not received enough aid, ask if other options are available. Most schools offer work study programs.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> Review acceptance letters! Make a choice.<input type="checkbox"/> Notify all colleges of acceptance or rejection of admission or financial aid offers by May.<input type="checkbox"/> Send deposit to chosen college.
