MVA Alumna Highlight

Leala Bealer-Suarez from the class of 1940 turns 102! Please join in on a little birthday fundraiser to honor the lovely Leala. We are asking for donations in the amount of \$102.00 to honor her respective age of 102! (Donations will go towards the gym redwood siding.)

Leala was born Sept 27, 1921, on a dairy farm in Granton, Wisconsin, the fifth of eight children, all of whom are now deceased.

An older brother suffered a severe disability in an auto accident, so their father sold the farm and the family moved to California where some of her aunts had already settled in the Los Gatos area. Their mom and brother went by train, but the rest of the kids and their dad drove their car and camped along the way. They sold Wisconsin maple syrup and popcorn to finance the trip. She turned 16 enroute.

Leala had already started at Hylandale Academy in Wisconsin, so she was able to transfer to Los Gatos High School upon arrival in the Santa Clara valley. There she felt out of place in such a big school after the quiet country school back home in Rockland. Many teen-age girls in those days found work as live-in housekeepers, so she did the same, securing work in homes in Palo Alto and Mountain View and thereby being able to enroll at Mountain View Academy and work her way through. One of those homes was the Head of Castilleja School, which she enjoyed very much. The families appreciated her housekeeping skills and even more, her lemon-pie-making skills!

She had very little time for fun activities outside of work and school, attending Mountain View Church on Bailey and occasionally taking the train down to see her parents who had settled on Quito Road in Campbell.

Her best friend in Academy was Mary Mitoma. After their Academy graduation, Lee was able to attend PUC for a short time, but Mary and her family were sent to a WWII Japanese internment camp at an unknown location and the two lost touch for several years. They were reunited after the war and remained the best of friends until Mary's death in 2014.

While Lee's four sons were still at home, she went to beauty school and became a beautician. She practiced this profession along with her excellent listening skills until retirement, bringing much joy to hundreds of devoted clients.

She and her husband of 44 years, Roberto Suarez, live in their own home on a ranch in Oregon, where they enjoy a large garden, a flock of chickens, a llama, and her homemade lemon pies. They attend the Milo Academy church.

Thank you Marianne Patton '64 for the above highlight on your Auntie.
